Animals and Products Covered under Existing Australian Standards

Proposal P1014

Primary Production & Processing Standard for Minor Meat Species & Wild Game

Executive summary

This Proposal will cover the remaining species not covered under Proposal P1005, including:

- the remaining species under AS4696-2007 *Hygienic Production and Transportation of Meat and Meat Products for Human Consumption* (buffalo, antelope, camels, alpacas, llamas, deer, horses, donkeys)
- the species covered under AS 4466 - 1998 *Hygienic Production of Rabbit Meat for Human Consumption*
- AS 4467-1998 *Hygienic Production of Crocodile Meat for Human Consumption*
- AS5010 – 2001 *Hygienic Production of Ratite Meat for Human Consumption* (ostrich/emu)
- AS 4464-2007 *Hygienic Production of Wild Game Meat for Human Consumption*.

The animals and products covered under the existing Australian Standards are summarised below.

Australian Standard	Animal/commodities
<i>Hygienic production and transportation of meat and meat products for human consumption (AS4696-2007)</i>	meat and meat products for human consumption that are derived from animals of the bovine (cattle), bubaline (buffalo), camelidae (camel), caprine (goats), cervidae (deer), ovine (sheep), porcine (pig) and soliped (horse) species slaughtered other than in a wild state.
<i>Hygienic production of wild game meat for human consumption (AS4464-2007)</i>	<p>Wild game animal means any vertebrate animal:</p> <p>(a) including a mammal, bird or reptile, but excluding fish; and</p> <p>(b) of a species that can be legally harvested; and</p> <p>(c) not husbanded in the manner of a farmed animal; and</p> <p>(d) is killed in the field.</p> <p>Wild game meat means the edible part of any wild game animal that has been dressed or prepared in a wild game meat processing premises and passed by a meat safety inspector as fit for human consumption.</p> <p>Wild game meat products means a product containing wild game meat.</p>

Australian Standard	Animal/commodities
<i>Hygienic production of rabbit meat for human consumption (AS4466-1998)</i>	Meat means the edible part of any rabbit and edible offal Meat product means a product intended for human consumption containing meat..
<i>Hygienic production of crocodile meat for human consumption (AS4467-1998)</i>	Crocodile meat means the edible part of any slaughtered crocodile excluding offal.
<i>Hygienic production of ratite meat for human consumption (AS5010-2001)</i>	Emu meat means the skeletal muscle of an emu (with or without accompanying fat) together with the sinew, nerve and blood vessels that ordinarily accompany the muscle tissue and that are not normally separated from it in the process of preparation for sale. Emu meat product means a product intended for human consumption containing emu meat. Ostrich meat means the skeletal muscle of an ostrich (with or without accompanying fat) together with the sinew, nerve and blood vessels that ordinarily accompany the muscle tissue and that are not normally separated from it in the process of preparation for sale. Ostrich meat product means a product intended for human consumption containing ostrich meat
<i>Hygienic production of natural casings for human consumption (AS5011-2001)</i>	The preparation and processing of natural casings derived from the intestines of sheep, pigs, goats and cattle.
<i>Hygienic rendering of animal products (AS5008-2007)</i>	All rendering premises operating in Australia and to all products of rendering operations including, but not restricted to meat meal, meat and bone meal, bone meal, poultry meal, poultry by-product meal, feather meal, fish meal, blood meal, tallow, poultry oil, fish oil.
